
A 2-DAY THESIS CLINIC ON THESIS WRITING STYLES & INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON HUMAN CAPITAL AND DEVELOPMENT IN AFRICA (ICHCADIA) was organized by ICT Academy of Indian Government, University of Port Harcourt Business School, Evangel University Akaeze and Welfare & Industrial Promotions (WIPRO) International.

Both events, which held in Ekulu Greens Guest House, GRA, Enugu, Nigeria on 12th and 13th November 2018 respectively, attracted abstracts and participants from various tertiary educational institutions in all geo-poltical zones of Nigeria and various countries of the world, including the United Kingdom and Canada.

Delivering a keynote paper titled *Common Errors in Thesis Writing*, Dr. Dominic Ojatta (University of Science, Pulau Penang, Malaysia), submitted that as fast food is depleting physical energy, so is fast food model of education impoverishing research and development in Africa. Common errors in thesis stem from poor attention to research skills, and include improper handling of various major parts of thesis: title, abstract, introduction, literature review, results, discussion, conclusion and recommendations.

Research funds and infrastructure are scarce. Funders have no confidence in researchers. Participants recommended the conduct of more Thesis Clinics and International Conferences for addressing these challenges, and commended the organizers for excellently putting together the much needed events.
